

"This is Lagos" From the Chairman of the Premier Bar

The emerging areas are outside the purview of the existing laws. Globalization is disrupting the way we practice law as we know it. It therefore becomes imperative for us to make concerted effort to adapt to the dictates of modernity or sink in the receding waters of the past. The revered Honourable Justice Chukwudifu Akunne Oputa JSC once admonished his fellow members of the Bench in the following words: "...as society is organic even so should law be. Anything organic is subject to the law of life which

is either grow or die. We are either ascending the steps of life or also descending into the precipice of death..." The sentiment expressed by the Learned Justice cannot be more apposite.

This Conference, therefore provides us the opportunity to regroup and equip ourselves with the requisite knowledge and skills to face whatever the future holds. The Technical Committee on Conference Planning has done an admirable job in putting a lot of things in place to make this Conference a memorable one. There are several technical sessions anchored by true professionals and

designed to stir up intellectual discourse on the emerging trends and how the law and lawyers can respond to them.

He has graciously agreed to deliver a Keynote Address at the Rule of Law Symposium apart from delivering a Keynote Address at the Opening Ceremony of the Conference on Monday, 26 August 2019.




At the invitation of the President of the Nigerian Bar Association (NBA) Paul Usoro, Senior Advocate of Nigeria (SAN), Horacio Bernardes Neto, President of the International Bar Association (IBA), will give an address at the opening ceremony of the 59th Nigerian Bar Association (NBA) Annual General Conference (AGC) on Monday 26 August 2019. The following day, Mr Bernardes will launch the IBA's landmark report Us Too? Bullying and Sexual Harassment in the Legal Profession and discuss the issues the report raises. He will also give a keynote address at the NBA's Rule of Law Symposium, on the importance of promoting and protecting the rule of law.

On Mr Bernardes' imminent visit, Mr Usoro SAN commented: 'On behalf of the NBA, I am delighted that IBA President Horacio Bernardes Neto is to participate in our Annual General Conference. He has stated that Africa is to be a priority of his two-year tenure with the aim of increasing the presence of the IBA in Africa and of Africa in the IBA. I am looking forward to mutual co-operation on his initiatives that will bring enduring change to the legal profession, including addressing the insidious issues of bullying and sexual harassment. This visit will build on and strengthen the existing relationship between our two organisations.'

Nigeria is the latest stop on an IBA global campaign trail to bring attention to the startling rates of bullying and sexual harassment in the legal profession and to work to halt such behaviour. The campaign will take place across six continents. So far, major international cities in Europe, The Americas and Australia have held well-received launch events. Next month the report will be launched in Asia, in South Korea's capital city, Seoul, during the 2019 IBA Annual Conference.

Commenting on the report, Mr Bernardes said: 'It is deeply shameful that our profession, predicated on the highest ethical standards, is rife with such negative workplace behaviours. Bar associations, law societies and law firms must lead by example and expose unacceptable behaviour. The IBA is working to ensure that eradicating bullying and sexual harassment is prioritised. We must work for positive change.'

About NBA 2019 AGC

CONFERENCE VENUES:

The 2019 NBA-AGC will hold simultaneously at the following venues:

- The Convention Centre, Eko Hotels and Suites "Eko Hotel" Plot 1415 Adetokunbo Ademola Street, Victoria Island, Lagos;
- Harbour Point Events Centre "Harbour Point" 4 Wilmot Point Road, off Ahmadu Bello Way, Victoria Island, Lagos.

COLLECTION OF CONFERENCE MATERIALS:

Delegates may pick up their Conference materials at Harbour Point from Friday 23rd August to Monday 26th August, 2019 - between the hours of 8 a.m. and 12 midnight each day.

PLEASE NOTE:

- i. There will be no collection of Conference materials at Eko Hotel.
- ii. To gain access into the Conference materials pick-up point, all delegates will be required to present a copy of the e-mail received from info@nbaconference.com confirming their registration for the Conference and a valid government-issued photo identity card.
- iii. Any delegate who is yet to receive this confirmation e-mail is kindly advised to immediately send an e-mail to this effect to info@ nbaconference.com
- iv. In addition to the foregoing, for Group and Sponsor delegates' registration, a designated proxy will also be required to present a printed letter of authorization from the organization, authorizing the proxy to pick up Conference materials on behalf of the other delegates from the Group/Sponsor.

CAR PARK:

COMMUNICATION:



Lagos, a boisterous and cosmopolitan city, is situated in the South Western region of Nigeria and is regarded as the commercial nerve centre of Nigeria.

As the most populous city in Nigeria (latest reports estimate the population at 21 million), the second fastest-growing city in Africa and the seventh in the world, Lagos has a rich history and cultural heritage. Lagos has expanded on the mainland, west of the Lagos lagoon and the conurbation, including lkeja (which is the capital of Lagos State) and Agege, now extends to more than 40 kilometres (25 miles) north-west of Lagos Island. The suburbs of Lagos include Ikorodu, Epe and Badagry.

GETTING AROUND

Most people get around Lagos by road. Commuters travel in private and public vehicles. Taxis (including those booked online) are widely available. Online taxi services include Uber, Taxify and Redcab.

If you are ever in need of direction, use the GPS on your mobile device as the city of Lagos (especially the Island) is well planned.

DINING

Lagos has a variety of interesting places to eat and hang out. Lagos restaurants serve a variety of local and international dishes, including Nigerian, Chinese, Mediterranean, Italian, Lebanese, Caribbean and Indian cuisine. The cosmopolitan nature of the city









makes it one of the best locations in the country for sampling a variety of dishes no matter what the size of your budget is.

SIGHTS AND SOUNDS OF LAGOS

The city of Lagos has some of the greatest sights in Nigeria with many interesting landmarks. These include the National Theatre, the Three White Cap Chiefs, Tafawa Balewa Square, the National Museum, Tinubu Square, Eko Atlantic City, the Lekki Link Bridge and the Third Mainland Bridge which is the longest bridge in Africa. Lagos has a variety of hotels ranging from three star to five star hotels and is well known for its sandy beach resorts, boutiques, music scene and vibrant nightlife.

FREEDOM PARK

Freedom Park is a memorial and leisure park dedicated to the preservation of the Lagos colonial heritage. The Park includes an open air stage for cultural displays and music shows as well as a food court, the Wole Soyinka Art Gallery and a resource centre.

LEKKI CONSERVATION CENTRE

The Lekki Conservation Centre ("LCC") was established in 1990 to serve as a biodiversity conservation icon and environmental education centre. It is run by the Nigerian Conservation Foundation which has a huge tract of wetlands which have been set aside for wildlife viewing. The LCC protects the wetlands of the Lekki Peninsula which consists of swamp and savannah habitats.

NIKE ART GALLERY

The Nike Art Gallery is a contemporary Nigerian art gallery run by a world-renowned Nigerian artist, Nike Davies-Okundaye. The gallery has a collection of about 8,000 diverse artworks from various Nigerian artists and is a popular cultural venue. There is are a bookstore and a Nigerian restaurant on the premises of the gallery.

TERRA KULTURE

Terra Kulture is an educational and recreational centre that was set up to promote the richness and diversity of Nigerian languages, arts and culture. Since it was set up 10 years ago, Terra Kulture has organised over 200 art exhibitions, 90 plays, 60 book readings, several language classes and excursions.

SHOPPING

There are several shopping centres in Lagos. These include the Palms Shopping Mall, Grand Square, Mega Plaza, Silverbird Galleria, Bijoux Mall and Murphis Plaza.

AIRPORT

Lagos as the commercial capital of Nigeria is fortunate to have largest airport in the country. The Lagos airport which was after a former late











head of state of Nigeria, General Murtala Muhammed who was killed doing a coup in 1976. The Murtala Muhammed Airport has both domestic and international wings. It is located in Ikeja area of Lagos, which is about 30km from Victoria Island.

ECONOMY

Lagos is Nigeria's economic focal point, generating a significant portion of the country's GDP. Most commercial and financial business is carried out in the central business district situated on the Island. This is also where most of the country's commercial banks, financial institutions, and major corporations are headquartered.

The Port of Lagos is Nigeria's leading port and one of the largest and busiest in Africa. It is administered by The Nigerian Ports Authority and is split into three main sections: the Lagos Port, in the main channel next to Lagos Island, Apapa Port (site of the container terminal) and Tin Can Port, both located in the Badagry Creek, which flows into the Lagos Harbour from the west.

ABOUT THE NIGERIAN BAR ASSOCIATION

The Nigerian Bar Association is the foremost professional membership organisation for Legal Practitioners in Nigeria. It was formally registered in accordance with Part C of the Companies and Allied Matters Act, Cap C20 Laws of the Federation of Nigeria 2004, as a Body Corporate (incorporated by Trustees) with RC No. 2368 on 8 April 1983. The Association is statutorily overseen by the General Council of the Bar, a statutory body established under Section 1 of the Legal Practitioners Act and responsible for "... the general management of the affairs of the Nigerian Bar Association (subject to any limitations for the time being provided by the constitution of the association) and with any functions conferred on the council by this Act or that constitution".

The Nigerian Bar Association is currently led by a President and 13 National Officers and operates from the National Secretariat; an 11-Storey Facility located in the Central Business District of Abuja, FCT, which is managed by the General Secretary and administered by the Executive Director and about 40 support staff. There are 125 active branches located across the 36 States and the Federal Capital Territory of Nigeria and it is also organized into Sections, Fora, (Ad hoc and Standing) Committees, and Institutes.

The Nigerian Bar Association is statutorily governed by its Constitution, Standing Orders, and Uniform Bye-Laws for its Branches, Sections, Fora and Institutes. It has a National Executive Committee which comprises of all National Officers, past Presidents and General Secretaries, Chairmen and Secretaries of registered Branches and Sections and 180 distinguished members of the Association vested with executive powers over the organization.

Each Branch of the Nigerian Bar Association is governed by a Chairman, 10 Branch Officers and an Executive Committee comprising elected officers, immediate past Chairman and Secretary and 4 co-opted members. It also has Standing and Ad hoc Committees. The Sections, Fora and Institutes are led by a Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Secretary, Treasurer and a Council comprising of its officers, immediate past Chairman and Secretary, 5 nominated members and 3 co-opted members.

Section 4 (a) (i) of the Nigerian Bar Association Constitution classifies a 'full member' of the organization as "any person duly enrolled at the Supreme Court of Nigeria as a legal practitioner and duly registered with one Branch of the Association". There are approximately 106,000 Legal Practitioners currently enrolled to practice at the Supreme Court of Nigeria out of which the Association has verified over 40,000 members.

The SECRETARIAT

The National Secretariat takes administrative responsibility of the Association's mandate. The Secretariat is saddled with the responsibility of meeting the needs and expectations of the Association's vast membership, National and Branch Officers, Committees, Sections, Fora and Institutes. The Secretariat provides administrative support, implements decisions of the Association's organs, and co-ordinates the Association's activities amongst others.

The Secretariat comprises of Directorates each supervised under the leadership of a Director who reports to the Executive Director. These Directorates include: Administration & Operations; Finance; Programmes; Bar Services; and Legal Policy and Regulatory Affairs.

OUR PROGRAMMES

The Nigerian Bar Association is focused on seven thematic program areas which include:

Administration of Justice:

One of the indices of good governance in a modern society is the presence of a smooth, efficient, and effective administration of justice system. There are many challenges that have been militating against an efficient and effective administration of justice in Nigeria. They include legal, institutional and co-ordination constraints, funding, corruption, lack of capacity, poor infrastructure. The Nigerian Bar Association has been a notable vanguard of reform of the Nigerian system of Administration of Justice, especially as it relates to criminal justice.

Anti-Corruption:

The anti-corruption framework in Nigeria is faced with tripartite problem of ineffective and weak policy, institutional and legal frameworks. The need for viable legal and policy frameworks is the focus of the Nigerian Bar Association's anti-corruption program. The Nigerian Bar Association is committed to this process and is using the tools of advocacy and technical assistance to support reforms.

Conflict Resolution:

Development can only occur in a peaceful and secured environment. The security challenges facing Nigeria, and Nigerians has driven the Nigerian Bar Association to play an active role in developing programmes and projects in the areas of conflict resolution and peace building.

Human Rights:

The Nigerian Bar Association has been a leading voice in the human rights field. The Nigerian Bar Association Human Rights Institute is responsible for formulating strategies which would effectively address the human rights abuses being faced by Nigerians. The Association has also launched a Pro-bono Service Scheme which aims to provide legal aid services to Nigerian citizens unable to afford representation for human rights violations. The service is to be provided by volunteer lawyers across all our 125 branches.

Justice Sector Reforms:

The Nigerian Bar Association is committed to supporting justice sector reforms across Nigeria and has engaged in a number of initiatives over the years to ensure that significant reforms are attained within the justice sector.

Elections and Democracy:

The Nigerian Bar Association is presently engaged in electoral reform with specific emphasis on the legal framework and lingering problem of enforcement of electoral laws. It is also focused on the reform of the Electoral Justice System

Rule of Law and Access to Justice:

The Nigerian Bar Association remains a notable voice that keeps the Nigerian government accountable for rule of law infractions.

The forum is aimed at promoting the welfare and capacity developmental needs of young lawyers while also ensuring that young lawyers participate constructively in Bar activities. Women's Forum is open to female lawyers of all age groups. The Forum aims to advance and protect the interest of female lawyers and women generally, promoting their professional development and encouraging a spirit of camaraderie among members. Corporate Counsel Forum acts as the focal point for discussion and activities for In-House Counsels that are members of the Nigerian Bar Association on substantive and managerial issues and serves a central role in policy making by communicating views of In-House Counsel to range of external authorities. Lawyers in the Media Forum was established to cater to the diverse needs of legal practitioners who practice as journalists and related media personnel.
