(a) An Order of Interim Injunction restraining the Defendan his agents, associates or any group nowsoever describe from organizing or holding the new yam festival of Mburub. Town fixed by the Defendant on 1" day of November, 202 as the Igwe Elect of Mburubu Town, pending the determination of Motion on Notice filed along with the application.

AND AFTER HEARING the submissions of Ike Ozor Esq., Learned Counsel for the Applicant;

THIS COURT HEREBY ORDERS AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. That Motion Ex-parte is granted as prayed.
- 2. That an Order of Interim Injunction is grante restraining the Defendant, his agents, associates or an group howsoever described from organizing or holdin the new yam festival of Mburubu Town fixed by the Defendant on 1st day of November, 2025 as the Igws Elect of Mburubu Town, pending the determination of Motion on Notice filed along with this application.
- That this suit is adjourned to 24th day of October, 202: for hearing of Motion on Notice.

THE COURT HEREBY ORDERS AS FOLLOWS:

- That Judement is hereby entered in favour of the Plaintiffs in the terms of their claims in paragraph 35 of their amended Statement of Claim.
- That all the reliefs claimed in paragraph 35(1) (2) (3) (4) (5) (6) (7) (8) (9) (12) (13) and (14) of the Plaintiffs amended Statement of Claim are hereby granted exactly as prayed as follows:
- i. That the Mburubu Town Union Executives represented by the 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th Plaintiffs, the Igwe's Cabinet represented by the 5th Plaintiff and Uhuegbe village whose turn it is to produce the next Igwe of the Community are the bodies with the exclusive functional roles in the selection, screening and election of new Igwe of Mburubu Town in accordance with Section 11 of the traditional rulers Law Cap. 151 Revised Laws of Enugu State 2004 and Section 9 and 10 on the establishment of traditional offices of the Constitution of Mburubu Town Union 2003.

That the presentation of Igwe Elect of Mburubu Town is the responsibility of the Nze's and ozo's of the Six Villages of Mburubu Town, the Chairman and Secretary of the Screening Committee and the Traditional Prime Minister and the President of Mburubu Town Union represented by the 1st and 5th Plaintiffs in accordance with Section 11 on the establishment of traditional offices of the constitution of Mburubu Town Union 2003.

iii. That Mburubu General Assembly represented by the 1st and 2nd defendants is not a legally recognized Mburubu Town Union and therefore has no functional roles in the selection, screening, election and presentation of Igwe Elect of Mburubu Town Union under the constitution of Mburubu Town Union 2003.



- iv. That the act of the 1st and 2nd defendants constitute themselves into unknown and unrecognized Mburubu Town Union to purport to have elected and presented the 3rd defendant as Igwe Elect of Mburubu Town Amounts to subversion of the provisions of the Constitution of Mburubu Town Union 2003 or the 1976 Constitution and therefore null and void.
- v. That the 3rd defendant having not come from Uhuegbe Village, being the next senior village to produce the Igwe in line with the Constitution is not qualified to contest for the Igweship of Mburubu Town.
- vi. That any purported election and presentation of the 3rd defendant by the self acclaimed Mburubu General Assembly represented by the 1st and 2nd defendants being an act ultravires the powers of the 1st and 2nd defendants and an unholy usurpation of the powers of the plaintiffs is hereby set aside.

- vii. That the process of election of the Igwe of Mburubu Community under the 1976 Constitution commenced by rotation from the eldest village being Umudara Village which produced HRH Late Igwe E. M. O. Eze,
- viii. That having commenced the rotation of the Igwe of Mburubu Community under the 1976 Constitution from Umudara Village being the eldest, the next Igwe of the Community shall come by rotation from the next eldest village being Uhuegbe Village where the 7th Plaintiff came from.
- ix. That the 4th and 5th Defendants shall only recognize an Igwe Elect from the second eldest village, being Uhuegbe Village in line with either the 1976 Constitution of Mburubu Autonomous Community or 2003 amended Constitution of Mburubu Town Union.
- x. That any purported election conducted or supervised by the 5th defendant purporting to have elected any Igwe for Mburubu Community during the pendency of this suit when the process as to whether the seat will be zoned to the 2nd eldest village by process of rotation where only eligible contestants from the village will be qualified to contest the election or whether the seat will be thrown open for every eligible



- contestants from the Community is yet to be determine, is hereby set aside.
- xi. That the 3rd defendant is hereby restrained from parading himself or holding out himself as the Igwe Elect of Mburubu Town.
- xii. That the 1st and 2nd defendants or any other person or group from Mburubu Town are hereby restrained from addressing or referring to the 3rd defendant as Igwe Elect of Mburubu Town.
- 3. That in respect of the relief claimed by the Plaintiffs in paragraph 35(10) of their Amended Statement of Claim, the court hereby orders the 1st to 6th Plaintiffs to immediately within the next 21 days to conduct an election for the production of the next Igwe of Mburubu Town or Community for the candidate from Uhuegbe Village only whose turn it is to produce the next Traditional Ruler of Mburubu and if the 7th Plaintiff is the sole candidate, he should then be returned unopposed in accordance with the provisions of the Traditional Rulers Laws of Enugu State 2004 and Exhibit PI on record and such election must be supervised by the 5th defendant or his representative or representatives.
- That in respect of the relief claimed in paragraph 35(15) of the Plaintiffs' Amended Statement of Claim, the defendants are hereby jointly ordered to pay the sum of N500,000.00 (Five Hundred Thousand Naira) only, to the Plaintiffs for all the embarrassments they caused the Plaintiffs and Mburubu Community in general.
- 5. That since the 1st and 2nd defendants failed to prove any iota of their counter claim, all the counter CERTIFIED TRUE COP accordingly dismissed as lacking in merit. claims of the 1st and 2nd defendants are hereby
